
#### **Rudolph Walker ISDA**

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# **Interventions at Freshsteps**



### **Guided Reading**

Our whole school guided reading initiative that began at the start of the academic year in September, is proving to be a success. We have seen a 63% increase in the reading ages of many pupils across the school. We have had 100% positive behaviour reports in guided reading since the initiative began. In guided reading sessions pupils are working on their reading, spelling, comprehension and grammar skills which supports them in all subjects across the curriculum.

We have found that staff have reported increased understanding and fluency in reading.

At the start of the Spring term, we assessed pupils with Test 2. Results from this showed 50% of pupils had increased in reading age. The range was minimum of 4 months-4 years increase in reading age. 16% of pupils remained the same age as the first test.

#### **Maths Intervention**

In this new term, we have introduced Maths Streaming for all children across our school. Children have been grouped based on their ability with an allocated teacher to support them in accessing appropriately differentiated materials. Children have already been very receptive to this, and we believe this will support them in reducing stress, anxiety and excelling progress. We cannot wait to see the progress made and the positive emotional impact on all of our young people.
